For a head start in achieving the six principles of success in college, do these five things now! You have some important months ahead of you. Here are five essential things to do to help secure your future at Purdue.







Be prepared — know Purdue's admission criteria. Also, keep in mind that November 1 is an important application deadline if you want to be considered for merit scholarships, the Honors College and for admission to some academic programs.





Take Purdue's minimum high school coursework (exceed these minimums if you can).

- Math: four years
- English: four years
- Lab science: three years
- Social studies: three years
- Foreign language: two years





Push yourself academically — even during your senior year. Success in rigorous courses not only prepares you for college admission, it prepares you for college success.





Study hard and take the SAT or ACT in the spring of your junior year. We only use the best score so be sure to have the testing agency send ALL of your scores to Purdue.



Be active in your school and community. Find what you love and stick with it. Long-term commitment to an organization is a sign that you'll be engaged in college as well.





Questions you should ask on your college visits:



What kind of mentorship opportunities does the college/university offer, e.g., with faculty, graduate students or upperclassmen?



What percentage of students are involved in long term programs, e.g., research opportunities for undergraduate students or semester long projects?



What types of extracurricular activities are available to connect students with similar interests and with opportunities to try something new?



Do students have ample opportunity for internships or co op programs?



How much has the cost of attendance risen in recent year.
